## Notes from our January meeting

An appreciative audience heard presentations by Elson Strahan and Arch Miller, about the exciting plans for our city by a partnership between the Vancouver National Historical Reserve Trust, the City of Vancouver, the National Park Service, the U.S. Army and private industry. Plans include new businesses and public use of the large historic area including Officers Row, the Army Barracks, Pearson Air Park and the Water Resources Center.

Also, the Dept. of Defense has selected Vancouver as one of six cities across the nation to host a tribute to those who served our nation in World War II. The celebrations August 25-28, 2005, will mark the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of World War II.
