## Will C-TRAN pull neighborhood service?

Recently there has been talk within city transportation circles about reductions in C-TRAN service that could include the elimination of Route 2 – the only route that serves the NW neighborhood, as well as much of Lincoln neighborhood.

C-TRAN staff members are looking at budgeting options for 2011-12 under scenarios that include increases in sales tax revenues and those that do not. My source tells me that

without additional revenues, there could be a service reduction of 35% in 2012 and an additional 10-15% in 2013.

**C-TRAN** is funded primarily through sales taxes, but also ride fares. Because of this, it is understandable that revenues

have been impacted by the recession. Now, unless C-TRAN increases revenue from a voter-approved sales tax increase, the only other option is to reduce expenses and that means services.

How expenses are reduced is the issue: should some areas lose all service altogether while others are lightly impacted? Budget cycle to budget cycle, C-TRAN must balance service coverage within the taxing district and the productivity of the routes as measured in ridership and fares.

The low productivity of Route 2 – due to low density, topography and lack of any commercial activity – has been aggravated by repeated cutbacks. Most recently, service has been reduced to once an hour and no evening service.

It is interesting that when the route operated every twenty minutes to J&M Plaza and ran until 10:30 p.m., it was the most productive in its history in terms of (See C-TRAN, page 4)
